ClubGRANTS is one of Australia's largest grant programs, providing more than \$100 million in cash each year by registered Clubs to a variety of worthy causes across NSW.

Charities, sporting organisations and not-for-profit community groups are among tens-of-thousands of worthy causes funded through the program each year.

In 2025, Arncliffe Scots Sports & Social Club proudly contributed over \$152,000 in cash grants through Category 1 and Category 2 funding to local organisations and sporting clubs who in turn execute programs within the community.
